Prom Dress Code and Code of Conduct

Prom is a formal and special night, and we hope to maintain the integrity and formality of this night by implementing these simple rules. This is a school sponsored event and anyone who attends the Prom must follow the Coral Reef Prom dress code.

School administrators will rule on the appropriateness of an outfit. If you push the limits of the dress code, you risk being turned away from the dance.

Students are expected to dance appropriately.

Any student who has questions about the dress code or would like to have an outfit pre-approved may bring a photo to Mrs. Santalo of you wearing the outfit for review.

Girls Dress Code

- Dress attire for this event is formal example: long dress.
- No form fitting or excessively tight-fitting dress may be worn.
- Dress may be backless if it does not drop below the waistline.
- Clothing must cover all undergarments and entire chest area.
- No deep V-necks. Anything that drops below the breastbone is not permitted.
- A two-piece dress is allowed if there is less than 2 inches of space between the top and the skirt. The skirt cannot begin lower than the waist.
- No see-through clothing allowed at all.
- No hats or sunglasses.
- You may wear a strapless dress, dress with spaghetti straps or halter top if it meets the guidelines above.
- No bra type or lingerie type dress is allowed.
- No slits higher than fingertip length.

Male Dress Code

- Formal attire is required.
- Dress suit, which includes a jacket, dress pants and tie or tuxedo must be worn.
- Dress shirt must be tucked in, and a belt must be worn.
- No jeans, joggers, cargo pants or shorts allowed.
- No t-shirt or polo shirt allowed.
- No turtleneck shirt or sweater is allowed.
- No non-formal headwear allowed (ex. baseball cap)
- Attire cannot have any holes or rips.
- No sandals, slides, flipflops, sneakers or crocs allowed.
- Must wear dress shoes and dress socks.

Important Information

- Tickets will be sold in advance through OSP or cash in the activity's office.
- Ticket and school ID must be presented to enter the Prom.
- Coral Reef students may bring a guest who is between the ages of 15-20 years old.
- The guest form **MUST** be filled out for the 2nd ticket.
- If guest meets the 3rd bullet guideline, The guest must provide an ID and follow the dress code. Guest ID must have their name, age, and picture. A current school ID is acceptable.
- Guest must arrive with the person who purchased their ticket.
- Doors close at 9:00 pm. If a student arrives after 9:00 pm, they will not be permitted and will not be refunded for the ticket.
- Once the student leaves the dance, they cannot return.
- Any dancing deemed inappropriate will not be permitted. Students and guests are expected to behave in a mature and dignified manner. Promiscuous dancing, slam dancing and moshing is not allowed and can cause students to be removed from the event.
- Students must wear shoes at the event, they cannot be barefoot at any time.
- There is a zero-tolerance policy on possession or use of alcohol, drugs, vapes, or other illegal substances at all school sponsored events. Being in possession of or under the influence of, any illegal substance will be subject to disciplinary action by the school and/or school police. The parents will be called and the student may risk graduation.
- Any student or guest who does not abide by the above dress code and code of conduct will be immediately dismissed from the dance and will not receive a refund.
